


What is Advanced Placement?

AP is Canada's largest enrichment program. This challenging and rewarding program is designed to provide motivated high school students with college-level academic courses. AP is considered a standard for academic excellence in Canada, the United States, and around the world. The AP courses give students intellectual responsibility to think for themselves and learn to reason, analyze, and understand.


Students may choose to take one or several AP courses. Exposure to higher level materials taught in the Advanced Placement courses prepares students to do extremely well on diploma exams.



Why take Advanced Placement Courses?

Upon successful completion of an AP course, students are eligible to receive credit or advanced placement at over 4000 colleges and universities worldwide, allowing students to advance into second year college or university courses.

Taking AP exams gives a clear understanding of what you need to do to succeed on a university exam. Your work is evaluated by college and university professors, and trained AP teachers using college level standards. AP prepares you for the rigors of university courses and your exam grades are excellent predictors of how well you will do in future university classes.



Advanced Placement Course Progression at HHHS

You may choose from a variety of AP courses at Hunting Hills High School. There is no requirement to take all the AP courses. Choose the courses that interest you. If you have achieved an honours mark in a Grade 9 or 10 regular stream course, you may progress to an Advanced stream in that subject after discussions with the teacher and AP Coordinator.

For students who wish to start in advanced courses from grade 9, please see the chart below. A final grade of 80% or above is recommended in order to proceed to the next course.

What AP courses can I take at HHHS?

Currently, HHHS offers AP courses in Art, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Chinese, English, Physics, Psychology, and World History. We also offer an option of taking the French AP exam and Spanish AP exam at the end of French 31A or Spanish 30-6Y.

Enrolling in AP classes doesn't mean you have to give up your other activities. Many AP students are also very involved with sports, leadership, music, drama, dance, and extra-curricular activities. You can develop a good balance between academics and other interests.



How does the AP marking system work?

A successful score on an AP exam is a widely recognized sign of college-level achievement. Each university has the right to decide the courses for which they will award credit, but normally grades of 4 or 5 are recognized. In many cases even if they do not award credit they will offer advanced placement, where the student can jump over a junior level course and enter a second year course.

At U of A, Advanced Placement students are eligible for multiple entrance scholarships, including Academic Excellence and Leadership awards. You should always check out the specific calendar for the universities of your choice for the most current information.
