Outcomes and Goals/Strategies	 All learning and work environments within Red Deer Public Schools are inclusive, respectful, safe, caring and free of discrimination and harassment. By February 28th, 2022, Red Deer Public Schools will develop a Board Policy to address bullying, discrimination and harassment that will, in turn, be implemented into practice by all schools (Welcoming, safe, caring, inclusive and respectful learning environments). By January 31st, 2022, Red Deer Public Schools will compile data gathered by all schools, through their consultation with parents and students, regarding how students see themselves represented in the larger school context. Outcomes and Goals/Strategies	 Through an emphasis on inclusivity and differentiation, all staff have the ability to meet the learning needs of all students through excellent instruction. Implement Collaborative Response Model to enable teachers to better address behaviour & learning in a collaborative format. CRM will also add a layer of support between classroom and Learning Support Teams. Implementation of transition meetings for students in inclusive education who are moving on from school. By June 2022 develop a complement of in school courses to replace ADLC. Red Deer Public Schools will provide the best alternative programming for students.
