Question from Kimberly White: "Why don't we at GCS have a 100% grad class success rate?" Geannette Lehman: "Students do not necessarily finish their graduation over more than the span of the three years, but we haven't had a student not finish in the past 5 years."

Question from Andrea Korevaar: Is there intervention for learners grade 2 and under for literacy as well, or only from Grade 3 up?

Geanette Lehman: Yes, there is a focus on helping all students move forward. It's just easier to benchmark from Grade 3. The lag just becomes more prominent as they age.

Masking and AHS/RDPSD Covid Protocols

Masking requirements and policies made by the District. Confusion was caused at first with the MOH's comments about masking not required if socially distanced. Our district chose to continue with masking requirements to keep staff and students safe. Feedback also taken from students and they are given mask breaks that are incorporated throughout the day. Subject is polarizing, but staff prefers that their students are at school and learning in person. Teachers are wearing masks all the time, students masked in the hallways. Mandates from the district will continue to be followed. Only one positive case at GCS at this point. In school transmission has not happened yet.

Natalie Ford created google doc so parents can anonymously ask questions:

- 1) Can students wash hands prior to food consumption vs only using hand sanitizer? Answer by Geannette Lehman: Can happen in some classrooms.
- 2) Will students be returning to full time online learning in January? Answer: Uncertain at this point. More information will follow.
- 3) How will Grade 7-12 learning look come Nov 30. Will it be the same as in the spring? Answer: It will not be the same from a curriculum standpoint. It will be more rigorous. More information to follow as it comes to light.
- 4) Are students asked to social distance at the playground? Yes. Playground grouped in zones per grade group. Also encouraged to keep distant.
- 5) Will K-6 be the same as normal, like support and such in place? Answer: More information to follow. Supports will remain in place.

- 6) If the learning level will be similar to a day of classes, if more than one student at home, what about those kids who don't each have computer access? Answer: Options to possibly loan out Chromebooks. Final answers will be provided.
- 7) Do you think subjects will be covered like the spring, some teachers teaching whole subjects? Or will teachers be covering their own classes? Answer: Uncertain. But a guess would be teachers will continue to teach their own classes. Meeting to discuss this has not happened yet. Teachers are prepared to have all their classes up on google classroom.
