New Directions:

Our focus the last number of years has been on quality programming and student retention in the middle school area. This goal will continue for our school. One of our new initiatives last year was the introduction of the Puerto Rico trip for grade 8 students. Students have the opportunity to use their Spanish language and to immerse themselves in the Puerto Rican culture on this trip. It was a great experience! We continue to build our program from kindergarten to grade 1 as these are our two main entry points into the Spanish Bilingual Program. We encourage Spanish speaking families to register their children in our school in other grades as another avenue to building our student population.

Opportunities and Challenges:

Our school has an excellent academic program and we are looking for more ways to communicate this with our community. Our provincial achievement exam results continue to be excellent and our school is a safe and caring place for students to find success.

Our challenge this year, as in other years, is in retaining our students from grade 5 to grade 6. Although we are keeping more and more students every year, we are still losing students to the dedicated middle schools that can offer programs such as band and woodworking that we cannot. We are continuing to look for ways to enhance our middle school program to encourage our students to stay up to grade 8.

A Year of Success:

Red Deer Public Schools continues to provide high quality learning opportunities for our students. We are proud of the achievements of our students and of the learning opportunities provided for them, reflecting both our vision: "A culture of respect, inclusion, caring and excellence, where every student succeeds" and the mission of the Red Deer Public Schools: "Striving for excellence by inspiring learning and nurturing hope in every student."

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Anecdotal Results:

- Our Provincial Achievement scores for grade 6 are excellent again this year. With the implementation of the new curriculum, only Science 6 and Social Studies 6 Provincial Achievement tests were written by the students.
- We are continuing to focus on our division 1 and 2 students in literacy and numeracy. Our use of numerous strategies such as Read Naturally Live have provided our students with amazing growth in their literacy abilities.
- This year, we are transitioning away from the Fountus and Pinnell reading assessments for our students. We will be using the Alberta Education literacy assessments for kindergarten to grade 3 and a new literacy assessment called the RCAT for grades 3-8.

Analysis:

• Based on the data, we can see that we are making huge progress in literacy but need to continue to work on improving our numeracy numbers. This will be a focus for our school this year as we create our intervention plans.

Action:

• We will continue with our great work with literacy, specifically with the Read Naturally Live program. We will also continue to use the UFLI literacy program. We will use the data collected from the provincial assessments to formulate our plan to improve our numeracy and literacy results. We will create a plan to work with students in numeracy to improve their achievement.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Anecdotal Results and Analysis:

• Our results are always very high with our students and parents agreeing that our school is a safe and caring place for them. There are a couple of results that we will be looking at more closely. We have gone down in the percentage of parents who feel their children are learning in ways that are meaningful and appropriate. As a school, we may need to communicate better with the parents in terms of what the students are learning on a daily basis. We have also gone down in the percentage of students who feel they are connected and feel a sense of belonging at school. There are times when there is conflict between students and their peers which could be why we had a lower number of students who were feeling connected at school.

Action:

• As a school, we will look at ways to improve our communication with our parents and families to ensure they are aware of all of the learning that is happening in our school. Our students learn in two different languages so learning may look a little different compared to other schools. In terms of our students, we will encourage our students to work on their peer relationships. This will occur during health lessons and throughout the school year.

Student Success And Completion

Student success and completion is the successful journey students experience from early learning, through all grades, to high school completion, and beyond..

Outcomes

- Children have an excellent start to their learning journey in Pre-K and Kindergarten.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Anecdotal Results and Analysis:

- Our Alberta Achievement Test scores were excellent both in Science and in Social Studies. Our school was well above the provincial averages in both subjects.
- As a small school, it is sometimes difficult to offer all the fine arts, career and technology courses that larger schools can offer. Our school does actually have many of the same options that other schools have and we also offer options that other schools do not have such as work experience.
- The Red Deer Public Schools' Values for Learning and Life in school are the basis for our Tombola tickets which the students earn to enter into our assembly draws for prizes.

Action:

- Academically, the students at Escuela Vista Grande are excellent. We will continue to work diligently to ensure all students achieve their academic potential.
- We will work this year to provide better information for parents on the different options we have here at Escuela Vista Grande as well as the benefits of our smaller class sizes.
- Students will also be reintroduced to the Red Deer Public Schools' Values in our large group health classes as well as in their classrooms.

We are always looking for more resources and new ways for our students to learn about indigenous ways.
